#### Legacy Sculpture Garden

On your way into the Beaverbrook Art Gallery be sure to check out the public art in the Legacy Sculpture Garden. 'The Birth of Venus' was commissioned for the Garden in 2009 in celebration of the Gallery's 50th anniversary and Fredericton's designation as a Cultural Capital of Canada. André Lapointe's impressive 12-foot high granite sculpture draws on imagery found in two famous paintings by Salvador Dali and Sandro Botticelli. The Garden is located next to the waterfront walking trail to the left of the Gallery entrance.

#### Downtown Fredericton Artist Market

Featuring work from artisans both emerging and established in a wide variety of media, the Downtown Artist Market offers a unique urban experience. The provincial art gallery of New Brunswick, the BAG is dedicated to acquiring, exhibiting and interpreting the best in Canadian and international art.

June – Sept – **The Language of Dress** – a selection of portraits that focus on the importance of dress, drawn from the 18th to mid-20th century works in the Gallery's permanent collection (artists Thomas Gainsborough, Joshua Reynolds, John Singleton Copley and more).
