PROVINCIAL HERITAGE PERMIT
Number: 2016-05 (Revision 2)

In accordance with the provisions of the *Heritage Conservation Act*, the City of Fredericton has given notice to the Minister that it intends to carry out the following activity at Officers' Square, part of the Military Compound Provincial Heritage Place (also known as the "Garrison District"), in Fredericton, New Brunswick.

- Square / skating Oval
- Lawn
- Enhanced Access
- Performance Plaza
- Stage and Stage Structure
- Improved Entrance
- Passive Green
- New Crossing and Site Access
- Café and Seating Area
- Removal of the Lord Beaverbrook Statue for the purpose of relocating
- Removal of certain trees, identified as numbers 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 8, and 16 to 20 (inclusive) on the attached plan

This activity is approved subject to the approval of final plans and specifications for the project.

Removal of the specified trees is approved subject to the following conditions:

- Nineteen (19) new trees must be planted on PID 75525055 to replace those being removed;
- a minimum of 25% of the new trees are to have the maximum DBH (diameter-at-breast-height) available;
- removal of all trees will be to grade with no subsurface excavation (i.e., no ground disturbance).

Any work beyond the scope outlined above will require a subsequent Heritage Permit, subject to review and approval of adequate final drawings and specifications.

Failure to comply with the terms and conditions of the permit may result in the revocation of the permit or an order to:

- Cease the work;
- Remove the contravention; or
- Restore the land, building or structure to the condition it was in immediately prior to the activity being carried out.

It is the applicant's responsibility to consult with Archaeological Services to ensure the work has the necessary archaeological monitoring and/or permits.

This permit is valid until: December 31, 2021
