In accordance with the provisions of the *Heritage Conservation Act*, the City of Fredericton has given notice to the Minister that it intends to carry out the following activity at the Military Compound Provincial Heritage Place (Garrison District) in Fredericton, New Brunswick:

- Removal of certain trees, identified as numbers 11 through 15 (inclusive) on the attached plan;
- Removal and replacement of the existing retaining wall and ornamental fencing to replicate existing;

This activity is approved subject to the following conditions:


- double the number of new trees must be planted to replace those being removed;
- a minimum of 25% of the new trees are to have the maximum DBH (diameter-at-breast-height) available;
- a Site Alteration Permit must be obtained from Archaeological Services in order to properly conserve the discovered and yet-to-be discovered archaeological resources associated with the past use of the site as a military compound;
- All work impacting the locations of these resources will require monitoring by a qualified professional archaeologist.

Please note that it is the applicant's responsibility to consult with Archaeological Services to ensure the work has the necessary archaeological monitoring and/or permits.

Also note that any work beyond the scope outlined above will require a subsequent Heritage Permit, subject to review and approval of adequate final drawings and specifications.

This permit is valid until: December 31, 2021
