**PROVINCIAL HERITAGE PERMIT  
Number: 2018-06**

In accordance with the provisions of the *Heritage Conservation Act*, the City of Fredericton has given notice to the Minister that it intends to carry out the following activity at the Military Compound Provincial Heritage Place (Garrison District) in Fredericton, New Brunswick:

- Removal of the balustrade (balustrade posts, "rails" (i.e., ornamental metal fencing) and copings) in Officers' Square;

This activity is approved subject to the following conditions:

- Prior to removal of the balustrade, the City must properly document the present-state of the balustrade and retaining wall for review and approval of Heritage Branch. This documentation is to be comprised of a combination of mapping and/or aerial photography illustrating the location and dimensions of the heritage features. Further, current and historical photographs with identifying labels and/or captions can be used. The photographs should include both contextual and detailed information.
- The balustrade components are to be removed with appropriate care so as to conserve as much material as possible for potential re-use in the eventual reconstruction of a replacement balustrade.
- Removed materials are to be stored in a secure (i.e., non-publicly accessible) location, in a fashion to avoid further damage or deterioration.
- Final construction drawings and specifications are to be prepared by the City and submitted to Heritage Branch for its review and approval by July 31, 2019 illustrating either:
  - The proposed means of rehabilitating the existing masonry retaining wall and replacing the balustrade with as much original material as possible and / or creating an interpretive display utilizing these materials; or
  - The proposed design to replace the existing masonry retaining wall and reconstruct a balustrade to replicate existing with as much original material as possible and / or creating an interpretive display utilizing these materials.
- Balustrade replacement is to be completed by:
  - December 31, 2021, in the event that the City proceeds with the Officers' Square project; or
  - December 31, 2020, in the event that the City does not proceed with the Officers' Square project.

It is understood that the scope of work covered by this Permit will not entail any ground disturbance. Should ground disturbance be necessary, it is the applicant's responsibility to consult with Archaeological Services to ensure the work has the necessary archaeological monitoring and/or permits.

Also note that any work beyond the scope outlined above will require a subsequent Heritage Permit, subject to review and approval of adequate final drawings and specifications.

Failure to comply with the terms and conditions of the permit may result in the revocation of the permit or an order to;

- Cease the work;
- Remove the contravention; or
- Restore the land, building or structure to the condition it was in immediately prior to the activity being carried out.

This permit is valid until: December 31, 2021.
