## Appendix A

### Officers' Square Revitalization Project – Phase 2A

Activities proposed for Phase 2A are limited to locations where there will be no ground-disturbance or where there is existing disturbance and no known archaeological resources. All ground disturbance will be monitored by an Archaeologist with a valid Archaeological Field Research Permit.

- Removal of the Lord Beaverbrook statue (to be relocated near the Beaverbrook Gallery);
- Removal and re-instatement of the monument to New Brunswick's 104th Regiment of Foot (reinstatement to be completed as part of a future phase);
- Removal of the capstone (coping) from the masonry wall;
- Removal and replacement of the retaining wall along Queen Street / Pointe-Sainte-Anne Boulevard (final finishes to be completed at a later phase) – monitoring required;
- Removal and reinstatement of the "Queen Street stairs" – monitoring required; and
- Removal of eleven (11) trees, more specifically 1, 2, 4 to 6 (inclusive), 8 and 16 to 20 (inclusive);
